A youthful and fresh wine with quince and pear drop flavours. Earlier picked freshness shows on the palate with crunchy green apple and grapefruit flavours. Good mouth feel and tangy finish.
- 20. Macon Lugny Les Genièvres Louis Latour ~ 2014 France** **£30.00**
(abv 13%)
Pale gold in colour, with a beguiling aroma of fresh apples, lemon curd and toasted citrus fruits atop a palate of fresh and crisp green apple acidity, buttery and peachy fruit and a long warming finish.
- 21. Pinot Grigio Franz Haas ~ 2014 Italy** **£34.00**
(abv 13%)
Deep straw yellow in colour with a fragrant floral bouquet with notes of sage, hay, almonds and sandalwood. After time in the bottle notes of honey develop. Fresh and full bodied with great finesse and elegance. Haas is one of Italy's finest producers.
- 22. Sauvignon Blanc Jules Taylor ~ 2015 New Zealand** **£31.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Delightful light lime in colour shows light aromas of fruit salad, passion fruit and nectarines. You may detect an undertone of jalapeno peppers and vine ripened tomato stalks. The wine rolls out to a long dry finish. Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc at its best
- 23. Chablis Cuvée Domaine des Malandes ~ 2012 France** **£31.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Expressing aromas of crisp fruit, there is plenty of citrus and green apple flavours followed by a rich mineral finish. A pure expression of the Terrior of the region.
- 24. Vouvray Champalou ~ 2012 France** **£31.00**
(abv 12.5%)
This wine has earned many plaudits from its admirers who describe the flavours of white flowers and a hint of grapefruit, off dry with an acidity that grows. Ideal for drinking now.
- 25. St Veran Domaine des Deux Roches ~ 2011 France** **£32.00**
(abv 13%)
Unoaked Chardonnay. Fresh and fruity with floral peach and citrus fruit aromas followed by mineral notes. You can also taste some honey background.
- 26. Pinot Gris Reserve Hunawihr ~ 2013 France** **£33.00**
(abv 13%)
Pale yellow in colour with gold hints. It has a smoky nose with elegant hints of pear, apricot and maybe you will discern a slight hint of caramel. Offers a nice complexity full of delicate flavours.
- 27. Sancerre Le Chene de Roy ~ 2013 France** **£33.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Pierre Girault has been making great Sauvignon wine for many years and the quality comes through. A fleshy style with soft nettle aromas and a light mineral complexity.
- 28. Pinot Gris Isabel ~ 2012 New Zealand** **£34.00**
(abv 13.5%)
New Zealand is not just about their famous Sauvignon Blanc's. This wine exhibits aromas of nectar, rose petals and delicate spice. There is a backdrop of apple and peach fruit.

- 30. Sauvignon Blanc Isabel ~ 2015 New Zealand** **£34.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Quintessential Marlborough Sauvignon. Herbal notes and exotic hints of guava and elderflower on the nose and flavours of gooseberry, citrus and ripe melons. Personal view is it runs Cloudy Bay very close!
- 31. Bourgogne Blanc Antoine Jobard ~ 2010 France** **£45.00**
(abv 13%)
The bouquet shows a good complexity of aromas of pear, straw and citrus. On the palate it's rich and focussed with a very full body for a Bourgogne Blanc. Good to drink from 2014.
- 32. Pouilly Fume Chateau du Tracey ~ 2012 France** **£45.00**
(abv 13%)
Pale gold with a silvery shimmer. An open and intense nose offering notes of blackcurrant and citrus fruit. Described by one reviewer as 'fresh citrus attack on the palate and seductive mineralogy'.
- 33. Alberino Quinta de la Terre ~ 2014 Spain** **£36.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Produced in the Galicia region of North west Spain. This wine has been likened to Viognier or even Riesling. It has floral aromatics, melon and a hint of star anise. The palate has tropical fruit freshness.
- 33a Gavi Guistiniana ~ 2014 Italy** **£38.00**
(abv 12%)
Produced only in the province of Alessandria in Piedmont. This wine is straw coloured with a greenish hue when poured. The nose is green apples, pears and a hint of almonds. There is a lively finish one expects from a great Gavi. New to the list and worth trying.
- 34. Pouilly Fuissé Domaine Saumaize-Michelin ~ 2011 France** **£50.00**
(abv 13%)
Probably at its peak for drinking. Lemon zest with hints of honey. Oaky and slight nutty aromas. The palate is tangy and fresh with a good level of acidity. Maybe a hint of nectarine on the finish.
- 35. Chablis 1er Cru Joseph Faiveley ~ 2008 France** **£50.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Light gold in colour. Has a fresh nose that shows green apples, followed by mineral and citrus aromas. Just getting to the peak of its drinking.
- 36. Chardonnay Cloudy Bay ~ 2008 New Zealand** **£50.00**
(abv 14%)
A complex nose that ranges from figs and lemon butter to more savoury elements of fresh hay and perhaps a hint of butterscotch. All rounded off with toasty complexity and a long finish,
- 37. Sauvignon Blanc Cloudy Bay ~ 2012 New Zealand** **£50.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Probably the most famous wine from the land of the long white cloud. Full of fresh herbal aromas and layers of ripe guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit flow through the palate giving a succulent and crisp finish.
- 38. Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Alain Chavy ~ 2010 France** **£70.00**
(abv 13.5%)
One of the great producers of Burgundy. This wine is bursting with ripe tropical fruit characters, balanced by a concentrated limey acidity and a lick of spicy oak,

- 40. Mersault Les Tillets ~ 2010 France** **£75.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A lovely nose giving a pure blend of citrus, orchard fruit, lemongrass and crushed stone minerals. It has a refined mineral poise, taut and disciplined.

44.	Malbec Reserva Terrazas ~ 2013 Argentina Young vibrant and balanced, this deep red wine with purple shades boasts ripe red fruits such as raspberry, blackberry and plum. A fresh floral profile of lavender and spicy peppery notes testifies to the wild aspect of the variety.	£35.00 (abv 14%)
45.	Duas Quintas ~ 2015 Portugal A blend of three grapes Tinto Roriz, Touriga Nacional and Touriga France and from two vineyards hence Duas. The wine is savoury, rich and full bodied. Blackberry and black plum with a wisp of smoke flow through the taste. A long finish offers many rewards.	£30.00 (abv 14%)
46.	Gran Passione Rosso Veneto ~ 2014 Italy Very solid structure to this wine due to the 14% alc. The oak aging gives pleasant spices and a vanilla nose. This wine is great with game, red meat and mature cheese. It replaces our Carmenere Grand Cru and does that very well indeed.	£30.00 (abv 14%)
47.	Bourgogne Rouge Pinot Noir Domaine Gilbert et Christine Felettig ~ 2012 France This wine exhibits the classic spicy southern Cotes de Rhone tightness you would expect from a young red from these parts. The wine comes from declassified Santenay and Maranges making it great value.	£35.00 (abv 13%)

- 48. Fleurie Jean-Marc Depres ~ 2012/14 France** **£35.00**
(abv 13%)
The wine is characterised with flavours of cherries strawberries and perhaps plums. There are hints of liquorice and spice. This is an easy drinking wine and goes well with fish.
- 49. St Emilion Château Rocher Gardet Montagne ~ 2012 France** **£36.00**
(abv 14%)
Made from 90% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc, you first notice the intense cherry colour. The first nose is truffle and then given some air ripe fruits come through. The wine is aged for 12 months in the barrel.
- 50. Château Poitevin Medoc ~ 2012 France** **£36.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Fresh and fruity, this has light tannins and a stalky black current character that will produce a smooth and juicy wine as it ages. Is coming into its drinking prime.
- 51. Rioja Ygay Reserva Marques de Murrieta ~ 2009 Spain** **£38.00**
(abv 14%)
You first taste the cherry and raspberry aromas; they then give way to a more raisin and jam smell. The simple red fruits and the oak from the barrels make this a highly drinkable but not too complex wine.
- 52. Pinot Noir Kim Crawford ~ 2013 New Zealand** **£38.00**
(abv 13%)
Aged for 60% of the time in French Oak barrels and the rest in stainless steel, give a hint of pepper on the palate. Lots of red fruit flavours and in the background do we get some baked spice and vanilla, perhaps caramel.
- 53. Syrah reyneke ~ 2012 South Africa** **£38.00**
(abv 14.5%)
Bright red fruit flavours with a slight aniseed spice. Liquorice and white pepper assail the nose followed by fragrant violet tones. Fine spicy tannins follow on to the end of the palate.
- 54. Three Cape Ladies Warwick ~ 2011 South Africa** **£38.00**
(abv 14%)
These three ladies have graced our wine list for many years. A blend of 40% Pinotage, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon and 30% Syrah gives rich plum aromas to compliment the full bodied smooth tannins. Pinotage with classic French varieties, great match!
- 55. Shiraz Cape Mentelle ~ 2011 Australia** **£40.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A typical Oz Shiraz. It has a great range of flavours, chocolate, spice, liquorice, pepper and plums. Perhaps a hint of rose petals and then you go into a long spicy finish. Described as 'classy' and we will not disagree with that.
- 56. Chianti da Vinci ~ 2013 Italy** **£40.00**
(abv 13.5%)
The blend is 85% Sangiovese, 10% Merlot and 5% 'other'. Rich and silky red in the glass, light reveals a clear and intense colour. On the nose, fresh dark cherries, spice and a touch of pepper. Then the palate smooth and fresh with a long late finish.

- 57. La Grola Valpolicella Allegrini ~ 2011 Italy** **£42.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A full bodied, intense and elegant wine. Dark red ruby in colour, it has a wide embracing bouquet with notes of wild berries, juniper, tobacco and coffee essence.
- 58. Pinot Noir Jules Taylor ~ 2013 New Zealand** **£43.00**
(abv 14%)
Delicately scented wine with floral and cherry aromas that flow into the palate where sappy tannins add an extra dimension. Can be described as a bone dry Pinot Noir that benefits from being in the glass.
- 58a Crozes Hermitage Les Amandiers Domaine du Murinais ~ 2013 France** **£43.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Produced from the Syrah/Shiraz grape this wine has a deceptive easy drinking style! There is a scent of black fruits, prune and a hint of coffee late on. That carries through to the palate giving an impressive finish. Another newcomer to our list and very good.
- 59. Chateauneuf du Pape Réserve Roger Sabon ~ 2010 France** **£55.00**
(abv 15.5%)
Fruit notes of black cherry and black currant intermixed with cedar wood, liquorice and just a hint of Provencal herbs. It is a ripe and full-bodied classic made in a pure and zesty style.
- 60. Pinot Noir Cloudy Bay ~ 2011 New Zealand** **£55.00**
(abv 14%)
Light bodied Marlborough Pinot from the famous Cloudy Bay. There are red berry fruit and sweet spices with silky tannins. An elegant rather than a blockbuster that develops in the glass
- 61. Beaune 1er Cru Les Greves ~2005 France** **£55.00**
(abv 13%)
Made from Pinot Noir grapes this Burgundy wine gives up lively raspberry and redcurrant on the nose. Sprightly with perhaps more charm than depth it has some tannic. Probably good until 2017.
- 62. Graves Les Hauts de Smith ~ 2008 France** **£55.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Nose of cloves, dark fruit and spices. On the palate it is medium to light bodied with present tannins but there is a good balance.
- 63. Pomerol Château Couprie ~ 2010 France** **£55.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A sophisticated wine that combines Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. Black cherry on the nose and a touch of new oak. Right for drinking at the moment.
- 64. Margaux Château Mongravey ~ 2009 France** **£55.00**
(abv 14.5%)
A blend of 75% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Merlot. We have been very lucky to secure this very good example. Dry yet rich, exhibiting all the classic flavours of Margaux. Ideal for drinking now.
- 65. Medoc Château Goulee ~ 2003 France** **£56.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Produced in the northern Medoc, this is a big wine with lots of fruit and exotic flavours. Expect to taste cassis, liquorice and smoke. Described as 'broad, savoury, expansive and pure.

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| 66. | Shiraz Charles Melton ~ 2000 Australia
Deep crimson in the glass. A nose of violets stewed fruits and violets. The palate then brings in prune and spice followed by new leather and sweet cherry background. Could be one of the best examples of a Shiraz from Oz. Produced in the Barossa Valley South Australia. | £57.00

| 67. | Marsonnay Phillipe Roty ~ 2007 France
The guru Robert Parker describes this wine – 'Impressive palate intensity of thickly skinned black fruits and smooth seamless tannins make for a Bourgogne of unusual polish'. | £60.00

| 68. | Nuits St Georges 1er Cru Patrice Rion ~ 2006 France
Made from Pinot Noir, opulent fruits are backed by brisk raspberry notes and a rounded texture leads to a fine perfumed finish. There is a plummy richness to this wine. | £80.00

- 75. Tinwood Estate ~2013 Brut England £48.00 (abv 12%)**
Our nearest vineyard. A blend of Pinot's and Chardonnay gives aromas of citrus and melon. As with the majority of English sparkling wine of 'medium' taste.
- 76. Canard Duchêne NV Brut ~ France £50.00 (abv 12%)**
This has been our 'house' champagne ever since we opened. Made with both Pinot Noir and Chardonnay it is clean and fruity in style. You can discern baked bread and bruised apple notes. Fresh and easy drinking and great value.
- 77. Pelorus Brut NV ~ New Zealand £50.00 (abv 12.5%)**
From a Chardonnay dominated blend of selected vintages, this is a fresh aperitif style of sparkling wine. Crisp apple flavours are backed up by a nutty yeasty complexity.
- 78. Canard Duchêne Rosé NV Brut ~ France £54.00 (abv 12%)**
With a delicate pinkish hue, this Rosé stands apart for its intense fresh fruit aromas of strawberries with a subtle hint of grenadine. A backdrop of mineral notes gives an enhanced freshness.
- 79. Nyetimber Classic Cuvée ~ 2010 England £60.00 (abv 12%)**
Cherie Spriggs the chief winemaker suggested that '2009 is the finest vintage to date of Classic Cuvée'. A blend of 55% Chardonnay, 26% Pinot Noir and 19% Pinot Meunier. A tart, zingy lemon twist and a beguiling creamy smoky finish.
- 80. Louis Roederer NV Brut Premier ~ France £70.00 (abv 12%)**
From the makers of Cristal, a deliciously rich Champagne, with an overt fruitiness and nutty yeasty notes. A long complex and rewarding finish is a hallmark of the house style.
- 81. Gosset Grand Reserve NV ~ France £85.00 (abv 12%)**
One of the best respected Champagne houses this blend of Grand Cru Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier. Wild orchard fruits, marzipan, sweet spices give the initial tastes. The palate is generous, full bodied and gives up flavours of Melba toast, roasted almonds, praline and lightly roasted coffee.
- 82. Laurent-Perrier Cuvée Brut Rosé NV ~ France £95.00 (abv 12%)**
Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier are used in producing this well recognised champagne. Savour the flavours of strawberries, redcurrants, raspberries and black cherries.
- 83. Veuve Cliquot Vintage Reserve ~ 2002 France £95.00 (abv 12%)**
Could be described as a gold colour with silver accents. You first get menthol, liquorice this is followed by cherry, plum and grapefruit. Then after a few minutes you taste almonds, hazelnuts and brioche. Lively and firm in the mouth, yet soft and velvety.
- 84. Dom Perignon ~ Moët & Chandon ~ 2004 France £175.00 (abv 12.5%)**
Light filled floral softness and a gritty minerality that is typical of Dom Perignon. Candied fruit and camphor leaf pervade and then give way to spices and liquorice root. This has to be the champagne for that really special time.
