1.	Macon-Villages Blanc. Vigerons de Grandes Vignes ~ 2015 France A fresh un-wooded Macon from the Chardonnay grape this is a very good example of this particular wine maker's skill. Citrus and apple notes, maybe a hint of pear, blossom and butter	£24.00 (abv 13%)
2.	Sauvignon Blanc Prestige. Domaine Vigné ~ 2017 France An undercurrent of gooseberry with a slight acidity that means this is an ideal partner for fish or poultry. Not as fruity as some of its New World cousins, maybe a touch more subtle.	£24.00 (abv 12%)
3.	Soave Classico. Terre di Monteforte ~ 2017 Italy A pale lemon yellow wine with stone fruits and almonds on the nose. Nicely balanced on the palate with good fruit flavours and a fresh acidity. Probably the driest of the house white wines.	£24.00 (abv 12.5%)

RED WINE

4.	Cabernet Sauvignon Domaine de Mont D' Hortes ~2015 France 100% Cabernet Sauvignon, this has an enticing nose filled with blackcurrant and wild berry notes. Medium to full bodied on the palate. The tannins are soft, juicy and blend well with the black fruit.	£24.00 (abv 13.5)
5.	Merlot Casa Azul ~ 2016 Chile Dark Ruby in colour with scents of red plum, blueberry and black fruits. The wine exhibits a juicy acidity with a faint peppery nose. The finish is lingering revealing further black fruit flavours.	£24.00 (abv 13%)
6.	Rioja Precioso ~ NV Spain In France you would probably call this a co-operative wine. However it is excellent, aged in young American oak barrels for a relatively short time (4-6 months), exhibiting complex characters of red berries, spice and vanilla. A blend of 80% Tempranillo, 15% Garnacha and 5% Gaaciano.	£24.00 (abv 14%)

White Wine

8. **Riesling Trimbach ~ 2014 France** **£22.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Unusual to find a Riesling in a half bottle. This is a classic young Riesling, aromas of lime and white peach. Described by one critic as 'understated elegance'.
9. **Sancerre Le Chêne du Roy ~ 2016 France** **£22.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Pierre Girault is one of the finest producers of this region. Producing very good wines from the Sauvignon Blanc grape.
10. **St Veran Louis Latour ~ 2012 France** **£22.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Emerges from the bottle with a white gold colour. There is an aroma of almonds, finishing with floral notes. A classic white Burgundy.
11. **Chablis 1er Cru Vaillons Billand Simon ~ 2014 France** **£27.00**
(abv 13%)
Pronounced nose of fruit and fruit and flowers, freshness and mineral touches, generous mouth with a nice roundness.

Red Wine

12. **Brouilly Château des Tours ~ 2016 France** **£22.00**
(abv 14%)
Full flavoured Beaujolais from a good vintage. Made with the Gamay grape. Should pick up aromas of cherries and strawberries.
13. **St Emilion Grand Cru Château ~ 2015 France** **£26.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Cassis, plums and some red berries amuse the palate. There are some restrained spice and strong tannins from the unusually large proportion of Cabernet Sauvignon used in this wine.
14. **Mercurey Domaine Faiveley ~ 2012 France** **£26.00**
(abv 13%)
One of Burgundy best producers gives us a taste of raspberries. You then move onto flavours of strawberries that flow to a lingering finish.

16. **Canard Duchéne Brut NV Cuvée Léonie** **£28.00**
(abv 12%)
Nearly 15 years as our house 'bubbles' is testimony to this champagnes consistent quality. Slightly on the dry side, this is a classic of its genre.

| 21. | <p>Pinot Grigio Franz Haas ~ 2016 Italy</p> <p>Deep straw yellow in colour with a fragrant floral bouquet with notes of sage, hay, almonds and sandalwood. After time in the bottle notes of honey develop. Fresh and full bodied with great finesse and elegance.</p> | <p>£34.00
(abv 13%)</p> |
| 22. | <p>Sauvignon Blanc Jules Taylor ~ 2016 New Zealand</p> <p>Delightful light lime in colour shows light aromas of fruit salad, passion fruit and nectarines. You may detect an undertone of jalapeno peppers and vine ripened tomatoes.</p> | <p>£35.00
(abv 13.5%)</p> |
| 23. | <p>Chablis Cuvée Domaine des Malandes ~ 2014 France</p> <p>Expressing aromas of crisp fruit there is plenty of citrus and green apple flavours followed by a rich mineral finish. A pure expression of the Terrior of the region.</p> | <p>£35.00
(abv 12.5%)</p> |
| 24. | <p>Vouvray Champalou ~2016 France</p> <p>This wine has won many plaudits from its admirers who describe the flavours of white flowers and a hint of grapefruit, off dry with an acidity that grows. Youn vintage but ready for drinking now.</p> | <p>£35.00
(abv 12.5%)</p> |
| 25. | <p>St-Veran Domaine de la Croix Senaillet ~ 2010 France</p> <p>An unoaked Chardonnay. Fresh and fruity with floral peach and citrus fruit aromas followed by mineral notes. As you go for the finish you will taste some honey background.</p> | <p>£37.00
(abv 12.5%)</p> |
| 26. | <p>Pinot Gris Reserve Hunawirh ~ 2016 France</p> <p>Pale yellow in colour with gold hints. It has a smoky nose with elegant hints of pear, apricot and maybe a slight hint of caramel</p> | <p>£37.00
(abv 13%)</p> |
| 27. | <p>Sancerre Le Chene de Roy ~ 2015 France</p> <p>Pierre Girault has been making great Sauvignon wine for many years and the quality comes through. A fleshy style with soft nettle aromas. Offers a nice complexity full of delicate flavours.</p> | <p>£37.00
(12.5%)</p> |
| 28. | <p>Pinot Gris Isabel ~ 2014 New Zealand</p> <p>New Zealand is not just about their Sauvignon Blanc's. This wine exhibits aromas of rose petals and delicate spice. There is a backdrop of apple and peach.</p> | <p>£38.00
(abv 13.5%)</p> |

- 30. Sauvignon Blanc Isabel ~ 2016 New Zealand** £38.00
(abv 13.5%)
Herbal notes and hints of guava and elderflower on the nose, flavours of gooseberry, citrus and ripe melons. In our view it does run the more famous Cloudy Bay very close.
- 31. Bourgogne Blanc Antoine Jobard ~ 2011 France** £45.00
(abv 13%)
The bouquet has a complexity of aromas of pear, straw and citrus. Rich on the palate with a very full body.
- 32. Pouilly Fume Chateau du Tracey ~ 2014 France** £45.00
(abv 13%)
A pale gold colour. Open and intense nose offering notes of citrus. Described by one reviewer as 'fresh citrus attack on the palate and seductive minerals'.
- 33. Alberino Quinta de la Terre ~ 2016 Spain** £38.00
(abv 12.5%)
From North West Spain this wine has been likened to a Viognier or Riesling. Floral aromatics, melon and a hint of star anise. Palate has tropical fruit freshness. Maybe a slight hint of saltiness.
- 33a. Gavi Guistiniana – 2017 Italy** £42.00
(abv 12%)
Produced in a very small area of Piedmont this wine has a greenish hue. The nose is green apples, pears and a hint of almonds. A lively finish one expects from a great Gavi.
- 34. Pouilly Fuissé Domaine Saumaize-Michelin ~2012 France** £57.00
(abv 13%)
Lemon zest with hints of honey. Slightly oaky with nutty aromas. Palate is tangy and fresh with a good level of acidity. A hint of nectarine on the finish.
- 35. Chablis 1er Cru Vau de Vey ~ 2014 France** £57.00
(abv 13%)
Light gold in colour, has a fresh nose of green apples followed by citrus and mineral aromas. A classic of the region.
- 36. Chardonnay Cloudy Bay ~ 2014 New Zealand** £57.00
(abv 14%)
A complex nose that ranges from figs to lemon butter to more savoury elements of fresh hay and a hint of butterscotch. Rounded off with a long finish.
- 37. Sauvignon Blanc Cloudy Bay ~ 2014 New Zealand** £57.00
(abv 13.5%)
Probably the most famous wine from the land of the 'long white cloud'. Herbal aromas and layers of guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit flow through the palate giving a succulent and crisp finish.
- 38. Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Les Folatières ~ 2013 France** £75.00
(abv 13.5%)
One of the great producers of Burgundy. The wine is bursting with ripe tropical fruit, balanced by a limey acidity and a lick of spicy oak.
- 40. Mersault Les Tillets ~ 2012 France** £75.00
(abv 13.5%)
Lovely nose giving a pure blend of citrus, orchard fruit, lemongrass and crushed stone minerals. It has a refined mineral poise, taut and disciplined.

RED WINE

41. **Black Shiraz Berton Vineyards ~ 2015 Australia** £29.00
(abv 14.5%)
Hailing from South Australia you have an intense colour and huge palate. Ripe Plums, blackberries, vanilla and nutmeg are the tastes. Then you get blueberries, liquorice and spice.
42. **Pinot Noir Ventisquero ~ 2015 Chile** £29.00
(abv 13.5%)
Deep Cherry red in colour. The nose offers a bouquet of fresh fruits such as strawberry and morello cherries with soft vanilla notes enhanced by the barrel aging. The finish is long reminding one of fresh fruit vanilla and spice.
43. **Brouilly Château des Tours ~ 2016 France** £38.00
(abv 14%)
This wine could be said to be more 'muscular' than some from the region. Deep red/purple in colour with a rich complex palate. Strawberry and floral notes with banana. Maybe the best value on the whole wine list.
44. **Malbec Reserva Terrazas ~ 2016 Argentina** £35.00
(abv 14%)
Young, vibrant and balanced, this deep red coloured wine boasts ripe fruits such as raspberry, blackberry and plum. A fresh floral profile of lavender and spicy peppery notes testifies to the wild aspect of this wine.
45. **Duas Quintas Ramos Pinto ~ 2015 Portugal** £35.00
(abv 14%)
A blend of three grapes – Tinto Roriz, Touriga and Touriga France and from two vineyards hence Duas. The wine is savoury, rich and full bodied. Blackberry and black plum with a wisp of smoke blow through the taste. A long finish offers many rewards
46. **Gran Passione Rosso Veneto ~ 2016 Italy** £35.00
(abv 14%)
Very solid structure to this wine due to the abv of 14%. The oak aging gives pleasant spices and a vanilla nose. This wine is great with game and red meat and mature cheese.
47. **Bourgogne Rouge Pinot Noir Domaine Hudelat-Bouillet ~ 2014 France** £37.00
(abv 13%)
A classic spicy southern French Cotes de Rhone with a tightness you would expect from a young red in these parts. The wine comes from declassified Santenay and Maranges making it great value.
48. **Fleurie Jean-Marc Depres ~ 2015 France** £39.00
(abv 14.5%)
The wine is characterised with flavours of cherries strawberries and plums. Hints of liquorice and spice. This is an easy drinking wine and does go well with fish. Yes it is red so what!
49. **St Emilion Château Rocher Gardet Montagne ~ 2014 France** £42.00
(abv 14%)
Made from 90% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc, you first notice the intense cherry colour. The first nose is truffle and then given some air ripe fruits come through. The wine is aged for 12 months in the barrel.
50. **Château Poitevin Medoc ~ 2012 France** £42.00
(abv 12.5%)
Fresh and fruity, this has light tannins and a stalky blackcurrant character that will produce a smooth and juicy wine as it ages. Probably at its drinking prime.

- 51. Rioja Ygay Reserva Marques de Murrieta ~ 2011 Spain** **£42.00**
(abv 14%)
You first chase the cherry and raspberry aromas, they then give way to a more raisin and jam smell. The simple red fruits and the oak from the barrels make this a highly drinkable but not too complex wine. It is a very good Rioja.
- 52. Pinot Noir Kim Crawford ~2015 New Zealand** **£42.00**
(abv 13%)
Aged for 60% of the time in oak barrels, the rest in stainless steel give a hint of pepper on the palate. Lots of red fruit flavours and the background we get some baked spice, vanilla and perhaps caramel.
- 53. Syrah reneke ~ 2014 South Africa** **£44.00**
(abv 13%)
Red fruit flavours with a slight aniseed spice. Liquorice and white pepper tickle the nose followed by fragrant violet tones. Fine spicy tannins follow on the end of the palate.
- 54. Three Cape Ladies Warwick ~2012 South Africa** **£44.00**
(abv 14%)
These ladies have graced our wine list for many years. A blend of 40% Pinotage, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon and 30% Syrah gives rich plum aromas to compliment the full bodied smooth tannins. Pinotage with classic French varieties, great match!
- 55. Shiraz Cape Mentelle ~ 2011 Australia** **£45.00**
(abv 14.5%)
A typical Oz Shiraz. Great range of flavours, chocolate, spice, liquorice,, pepper and plums. Perhaps a hint of rose petals and then onto a long spicy finish. Described as 'classy' and if you can apply that to Oz (sorry) we have to agree. A real boomer!
- 56. Chianti da Vinci ~ 2013 Italy** **£43.00**
(abv 13.5%)
The blend is 85% Sangiovese, 10% Merlot and 5% 'other'. Rich and silky red in the glass, light reveals a clear and intense colour. On the nose, fresh dark cherries, spice and a touch of pepper. Then the palate smooth and fresh with a long finish.
- 57. Valpolicella la Grola Allegrini ~ 2017 Italy** **£45.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A full bodied, intense and full bodied wine. Dark red ruby in colour, it has a wide embracing bouquet with notes of wild berries, juniper, tobacco and coffee essence.
- 58. Pinot Noir Jules Taylor ~ 2016 New Zealand** **£46.00**
(abv 14%)
Delicately scented wine with floral and cherry aromas that flow into the palate where sappy tannins add an extra dimension. A Pinot Noir that does benefit from being in the glass.
- 58a Crozes Hermitage Domaine Melody ~2016 France** **£50.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Produced from the Syrah/Shiraz grape this wine has a deceptive easy drinking style! There is the scent of black fruits, prune and a hint of coffee late on, carries through to the palate giving an impressive finish.
- 59. Chateauneuf du Pape Réserve Roger Sabon ~ 2010 France** **£58.00**
(abv 15.5%)
Fruit notes of black cherry and blackcurrant intermingle with cedar wood, liquorice and just a hint of Provencal herbs. It is a ripe and full-bodied classic made in a pure and zesty style.

- 60. Pinot Noir Cloudy Bay ~ 2013 New Zealand** £58.00
(abv 14%)
Light bodied Pinot from the famous Cloudy Bay. There are red berry fruits and sweet spices with silky tannins. An elegant rather than a blockbuster that does develop in the glass.
- 61. Beaune 1er Prunier Bonheur ~ 2009 France** £58.00
(abv 13%)
Made from pinot Noir grapes this fine example of Burgundy gives up lively raspberry and redcurrant on the nose. Sprightly with perhaps more charm than depth. Just right for drinking now.
- 62. Graves Les Hauts de Smith ~ 2008 France** £58.00
(abv 13.5%)
There is a nose of cloves, dark fruit and spices. On the palate it is more light-bodied to medium with tannins present. Having said that the wine does have a good balance.
- 63. Pomerol Château Les Cruzelles ~ 2011 France** £63.00
(abv 13.5%)
A sophisticated wine that combines Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. Black cherry on the nose and maybe just a hint of new oak. Good to drink for the next two years.
- 64. Margaux Château la Gurgue ~ 2010 France** £65.00
(abv14.5%)
A blend of 75% Cabernet Sauvignon and 25% Merlot. We have been lucky to secure this great example of Margaux. Dry yet rich exhibiting the classic flavours of the region.
- 65. Medoc Château Goulee ~ 2003 France** £65.00
(abv 13.5%)
Produced in the Northern Medoc, this is a big wine with lots of fruit and exotic flavours. Expect to taste cassis, liquorice and smoke. Described as 'broad, expansive, savoury and pure'.
- 66. Shiraz Rosemont Estate ~ 2003 Australia** £65.00
(abv 15%)
Deep crimson in the glass. A nose of violets and stewed fruits. The palate then brings in prunes and spice followed by new leather and sweet cherry background. Produced in the Upper Hunter valley of South East Australia. A real Oz classic Shiraz.
- 67. Marsonnay Philip Roty ~ 2007 France** £65.00
(abv 12.5%)
The American wine guru Robert Parker described this wine as 'impressive palate with an intensity of thickly skinned black fruits and smooth seamless tannins make for a Bourgogne of unusual polish'. So there!
- 68. Nuits St Georges Château la Gurgue ~ 2010 France** £85.00
(abv 13%)
Our red list signs off with a classic made from Pinot Noir. Opulent fruits are backed by raspberry notes and a rounded texture leads to a fine perfumed finish. There is a plummy richness to the wine.

ROSÉ WINE

- 69. Syrah Cabernet Rosé Vigne Lourac Cotes du Tarn ~ 2016 France** **£27.00**
(abv 12%)
- A medium rosé with a soft red fruit nose. Clean and dry on the palate with freshness and attractive berry fruits. It has an elegant and light finish.
- 70. Pinot Grigio Rosata Ponte Pietra ~ 2017 Italy** **£32.00**
(abv 12%)
- A Lovely salmon pink colour, this Rosata is fresh and crisp with a strawberry perfume which gives way to vibrant cherry on the palate. There is a slight savoury note that adds depth and lively acidity which gives a crisp finish when the strawberries appear again.
- 71. Domaine Triennes ~ 2016 France** **£35.00**
(abv 12.5%)
- This rosé from Provence has been described as the 'hippest' rosé in London at the moment! It really does invoke summer days in that region of France. It has a pretty pale hue and exhibit's a freshness due to its early bottling. There are aromas of red berries, strawberries, grapefruit and a hint of orange peel. It is a very quaffable wine, not only for the summer.

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| 74. | Prosecco Metodo Zero de Stafani ~ NV Italy
Plenty of fruit on the palate with aromas of apple, a little banana and a floral finish. Ideal as an aperitif. Great Italian fizz. | £30.00
(abv 11%) |
| 75. | Tinwood Estate Sparkling Wine Brut ~ 2013 England
Two miles north of us as the drunken crow flies! Blend of Pinot and Chardonnay gives aromas of citrus and melon. As with most English 'sparklers' a medium taste. | £50.00
(abv 12%) |
| 76. | Champagne Brut Canard Duchéne ~ NV France
This has been our 'house champagne for 15 years a testament to its consistency and quality. Blend of Pinot and Chardonnay it is clean and fruity. Maybe flavours of baked bread and bruised apples. Fresh and easy drinking. | £50.00
(abv 12%) |
| 77. | Pelorus Sparkling Wine ~ NV New Zealand
Chardonnay dominates in this blend from different vintages. Ideal as an aperitif, crisp apple flavours backed by a nutty, yeasty complexity. Still a bit of a surprise from New Zealand. | £50.00
(abv 12.5%) |
| 78. | Champagne Brut Rosé Canard Duchéne ~ NV France
A delicate pink hue this wine stands apart for its intense fresh fruit aromas of strawberries with a subtle hint of grenadine. A backdrop of mineral notes gives an enhanced freshness. | £55.00
(abv 12%) |
| 79. | Nyetimber Sparkling Wine Classic Cuvée ~ NV England
A blend of 55% Chardonnay, 26% Pinot Noir and 19% Pinot Meunier. It has a tart, zingy lemon twist and a smoky creamy finish. Slightly drier than most English sparkling wine. | £65.00
(abv 12%) |
| 80. | Champagne Louis Roederer Brut Premier ~ NV France
From the makers of Cristal, a deliciously rich Champagne with an overt fruitiness and nutty yeast notes. Long complex and rewarding id a hallmark of the house style. | £75.00
(abv 12%) |
| 81. | Champagne Gosset Grand Reserve ~ NV France
This could be classed as the champagne expert's champagne, a blend of Grand Cru Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier. Orchard fruits, marzipan, sweet spices are felt initially. Then maybe melba toast, roasted almonds and lightly roasted coffee. We do like it! | £85.00
(abv 12%) |
| 82. | Champagne Laurent-Perrier Cuvée Brut Rosé ~ NV France
Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier are blended to make this well known Rosé. There are strawberries, redcurrants, raspberries and black cherries to savour. | £95.00
(abv 12%) |
| 83. | Champagne Veuve Cliquot NV ~ France
A gold colour with silver accents, you then taste cherries, plum and grapefruit with maybe a hint of liquorice. You move onto almonds, hazelnuts and brioche. | £70.00
(abv 12%) |
| 84. | Champagne Dom Perignon Moet & Chandon ~ 2006 France
Floral softness and a minerality this is Dom Perignon. Candied fruits and camphor leaf pervade then spices and liquorice root hit the palate. It is the king of champagnes and ideal for that really special occasion. | £200.00
(abv 12.5%) |

DESSERT WINES

- 86. Muscat Beaune de Venise Domaine de Durban ~ 2013 France** £45.00
This fine dessert wine expresses itself with a high degree of finesse. Delicate flavours tickle the tongue with notes of pear and apricot. Good with all desserts especially chocolate. **Per Glass £9.00 (125ml) (abv 15%)**
- 87. Sauternes 1er Grand Cru Classé Chateau de Rayne Vigneau ~ 2007 France** £65.00
This is a fine example of this famous dessert wine. It is a blend of Sémillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle grapes that have been infected by *Botrytis Cinerea* or *noble rot* which causes the grapes to become raisined giving the distinct sweetness to the wine. Because of this the production of the wine can vary considerably between vintages. **Per Glass £12.50 (125ml) (abv 14%)**
- 89. Chateau Boucasse Vendemiare ~ 2005 France** £24.00
From South West France this wine has an intense nose of honeyed Satsuma and spice. A tropical fruit character on the palate with a fine concentrated finish. **(500ml) (abv 12.5%)**
- 89a Black Muscat Elysium ~ 2014 USA** £25.00
This wine hails from California and the name Elysium is the Greek for heaven. Take your first sip and you will see it is aptly named. There is a rose aroma and a whole array of other fruits hit your palate. Personal favourite is to pour it over vanilla ice cream, very decadent! **(375ml) (abv 15%)**

MATURE PORT WINE

- 90. 10 year old Tawny Port Taylors ~ Portugal** £50.00
