1.	Macon-Uchizy Talmard~ 2020 France A fresh un-wooded Macon from the Chardonnay grape. Bright and balanced, notes of lemon, citrus and crisp green apples. A good value example of this wine from Burgundy.	£32.50 (abv 13.0%)
2.	Sauvignon Blanc Les Fleurs du Montblanc ~ 2021 France An undercurrent of gooseberry with a slight acidity that means this is an ideal partner for fish or poultry. Not as fruity as some of its New World cousins, maybe a touch more subtle.	£32.50 (abv 12.5%)
3.	Soave Classico. Terre di Monteforte ~ 2021 Italy A pale lemon-yellow wine with stone fruits and almonds on the nose. Nicely balanced on the palate with good fruit flavours and a fresh acidity. Probably the driest of the house white wines.	£32.50 (abv 12.5%)

4.	Cabernet Sauvignon Domaine de Mont D' Hortes ~ 2020 France 100% Cabernet Sauvignon, this has an enticing nose filled with blackcurrant and wild berry notes. Medium to full bodied on the palate. The tannins are soft, juicy and blend well with the black fruit.	£32.50 (abv 13.5%)
5.	Merlot Vina Pelequin ~ 2020 Chile Well balanced wine with a rounded body and smooth tannins. Red/Violet in colour. Aromas of red fruit and plums. Long delightful finish. A fine example of a Chilean Merlot.	£32.50 (abv 12.5%)
6.	Rioja Escena ~ 2021 Spain Exhibiting complex characters of red berries, spice and vanilla. As with all Rioja's it is a blend of blend of Tempranillo, Garnacha and Graciano. It has been described as having 'Juicy fruit driven character'	£32.50 (abv 14%)

White Wine

8. **Riesling Trimbach ~ 2020 France** **£27.00**
(abv 13%)
Unusual to find a Riesling in a half bottle. This is a classic young Riesling, aromas of lime and white peach. Described by one critic as 'understated elegance'.
9. **Pouilly Fumé Domaine Sébastien Treuillet ~ 2020 France** **£29.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Due to poor harvest and economics, we are finding ½'s of Sancerre hard to get hold of. This is a great half and with dry flinty depths, tangy mineral complexity, zippy green fruit.
10. **Mercurey Domaine Fauveley ~ 2019 France** **£29.00**
(abv 12.5%)
This starts with an elegant nose, then fruity and floral notes. A classic white Burgundy replacing a long-time favourite St Veran.
11. **Chablis Drouhin Vaudon ~ 2018 France** **£30.00**
(abv 13%)
Pronounced nose of fruit and fruit and flowers, freshness and mineral touches, generous mouth with a nice roundness.

Red Wine

12. **Brouilly Château des Tours ~ 2019 France** **£29.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Full flavoured Beaujolais from a good vintage. Made with the Gamay grape. Should pick up aromas of cherries and strawberries.
13. **Château Carigan ~ 2014 France** **£30.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Merlot dominated wine from the slopes above the river Garonne. Rich and finely balanced with juicy red fruits and a dry 'core'. Best drunk from 2019
14. **Chorey – Les – Beaune Tollat-Beaut ~ 2019 France** **£29.00**
(abv 13%)
One of Burgundy's underrated producers, this is made with the Pinot Noir grape. A delicate and elegant wine. Red fruits and flowers on the nose with red cherries. A refined and subtle palate.

16. **Canard Duchéne Brut NV Cuvée Léonie** **£35.00**
(abv 12%)
Nearly 20 years as our house 'bubbles' is testimony to this champagne's consistent quality. Slightly on the dry side, this is a classic of its genre.

WHITE WINE

- 17. White Rioja ~ El Meson ~ 2021 Spain** **£36.00**
(abv 12.5%)
A real hit at a recent Seafood Tasting evening it has to go on the wine list. 100% Viura grape variety it is extremely drinkable. Fruity, dry and a refreshing palate. Also, a great price!
- 18. Viognier Leduc ~ 2021 France** **£38.00**
(abv 12.5%)
A vibrant, luminous colour with green hues. On the nose, peach, apricot and almond flavours prevail with a refreshing yet fruity palate gives a smooth and round finish.
- 19. Chenin Blanc 'Petit' Ken Forrester ~ 2022 South Africa** **£38.00**
(abv 13%)
A youthful wine with quince and pear flavours. Freshness shows on the palate with crunchy green apple and grapefruit flavours. Good mouth feel and tangy finish.
- 20. Macon Lugny Les Genièvres Louis Latour ~ 2020 France** **£39.00**
(abv 13%)
Pale gold in colour, with an aroma of fresh apples, lemon curd and toasted citrus fruits atop a palate of crisp green apple, buttery and peachy fruit and a long warming finish.
- 21. Pinot Grigio Franz Haas ~ 2020 Italy** **£39.00**
(abv 13%)
Deep straw yellow in colour with a fragrant floral bouquet with notes of sage, hay, almonds and sandalwood. After time in the bottle notes of honey develop. Fresh and full bodied with great finesse and elegance.
- 22. Sauvignon Blanc Jules Taylor ~ 2022 New Zealand** **£40.00**
(abv 13%)
Delightful light lime in colour shows light aromas of fruit salad, passion fruit and nectarines. You may detect an undertone of jalapeno peppers and vine ripened tomatoes.
- 23. Chablis Cuvée Domaine des Malandes ~ 2019 France** **£44.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Expressing aromas of crisp fruit there is plenty of citrus and green apple flavours followed by a rich mineral finish. A pure expression of the terrior of the region.
- 24. Gran Passione Bianco ~ 2020 Italy** **£40.00**
(abv 13.0%)
After being featured on several Tasting Menus this wine has made it onto the wine list. Straw yellow in colour it has flower aromas, light vanilla notes, crisp and well balanced with a creamy finish.
- 26. Pinot Gris Reserve Hunawehr ~ 2018 France** **£44.00**
(abv 13%)
Pale yellow in colour with gold hints. It has a smoky nose with elegant hints of pear, apricot and maybe a slight hint of caramel
- 27. Sancerre Henry Natter ~ 2020 France** **£47.00**
(12.5%)
Henry Natter has been making great Sauvignon wine for some years and the quality comes through. A fleshy style with soft nettle aromas. Offers a nice complexity full of delicate flavours.
- 28. Pinot Gris Kumeu River ~ 2019 New Zealand** **£45.00**
(abv 13.5%)
New Zealand is not just about their Sauvignon Blanc's. This wine exhibits aromas of rose petals and delicate spice. There is a backdrop of apple and peach.

- 30. Aligote Gilbert & Christine Felittig ~ 2017 France** **£45.00**
(abv 13%)
A welcome return to the wine list for this green and flinty Burgundy. 2019 was a good year and the wine is well priced. Goes well with fish, shellfish, especially scallops.
- 31. Bourgogne Chardonnay Buisson Battault ~ 2018 France** **£45.00**
(abv 12%)
Ripeness, smooth with a tight edge of acidity. There is a richness of white fruits and hints of vanilla as well as a hint of spice. Although this producer is known for their Mersault they have come up with a Chardonnay winner! **OUT OF STOCK – Awaiting new vintage.**
- 32. Pouilly Fume Treuillet ~ 2020 France** **£49.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A pale gold colour, open and intense nose offering notes of citrus. Described by one reviewer as 'fresh citrus attack on the palate and seductive mineral's'.
- 33. Alberino Ribera ~ 2021 Spain** **£48.00**
(abv 12.5%)
From North West Spain this wine has been likened to a Viognier or Riesling. Floral aromatics, melon and a hint of star anise. Palate has tropical fruit freshness. Maybe a slight hint of saltiness.
- 33a. Gavi Guistiniana – 2021 Italy** **£46.00**
(abv 12.5%)
Produced in a very small area of Piedmont this wine has a greenish hue. The nose is green apples, pears and a hint of almonds. A lively finish one expects from a great Gavi.
- 34. Pouilly Fuissé Gilles Morat ~2017 France** **£68.00**
(abv 13%)
Lemon zest with hints of honey. Slightly oaky with nutty aromas. Palate is tangy and fresh with a good level of acidity. A hint of nectarine on the finish.
- 35. Chablis 1er Cru Vau de Vey ~ 2019 France** **£68.00**
(abv 13%)
Light gold in colour, has a fresh nose of green apples followed by citrus and mineral aromas. A classic of the region.
- 36. Chardonnay Cloudy Bay ~ 2019 New Zealand** **£70.00**
(abv 13%)
A complex nose that ranges from figs to lemon butter to more savoury elements of fresh hay and a hint of butterscotch. Rounded off with a long finish.
- 37. Sauvignon Blanc Cloudy Bay ~ 2016 New Zealand** **£70.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Probably the most famous wine from the land of the 'long white cloud'. Herbal aromas and layers of guava and tropical fruit. Gooseberries and passion fruit flow through the palate giving a succulent and crisp finish.
- 38. Puligny-Montrachet 1er Cru Pernet Belicad ~ 2020 France** **£85.00**
(abv 13.5%)
One of the great producers of Burgundy. The wine is bursting with ripe tropical fruit, balanced by a limey acidity and a lick of spicy oak.
- 40. Mersault Christophe Vaudoisey ~ 2018 France** **£87.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Lovely nose giving a pure blend of citrus, orchard fruit, lemongrass and crushed stone minerals. It has a refined mineral poise, taut and disciplined.

RED WINE

41. **Black Shiraz Berton Vineyards ~ 2018 Australia** £38.00
(abv 14.5%)
Hailing from South Australia you have an intense colour and huge palate. Ripe Plums, blackberries, vanilla and nutmeg are the tastes. Then you get blueberries, liquorice and spice.
42. **Pinot Noir Ventisquero ~ 2018 Chile** £38.00
(abv 13%)
Deep Cherry red in colour. The nose offers a bouquet of fresh fruits such as strawberry and morello cherries with soft vanilla notes enhanced by the barrel aging. The finish is long reminding one of fresh fruit vanilla and spice.
43. **Brouilly Château des Tours ~ 2020 France** £50.00
(abv 13.5%)
This wine could be said to be more 'muscular' than some from the region. Deep red/purple in colour with a rich complex palate. Strawberry and floral notes with banana. Maybe the best value on the whole wine list.
44. **Malbec Reserva Terrazas ~ 2019 Argentina** £45.00
(abv 13%)
Young, vibrant and balanced, this deep red coloured wine boasts ripe fruits such as raspberry, blackberry and plum. A fresh floral profile of lavender and spicy peppery notes testifies to the wild aspect of this wine.
45. **Duas Quintas Ramos Pinto ~ 2019 Portugal** £45.00
(abv 13.5%)
A blend of three grapes – Tinto Roriz, Touriga and Touriga France and from two vineyards hence Duas. The wine is savoury, rich and full bodied. Blackberry and black plum with a wisp of smoke blow through the taste. A long finish offers many rewards
46. **Gran Passione Rosso Veneto ~ 2020 Italy** £45.00
(abv 14%)
Very solid structure to this wine due to the abv of 14%. The oak aging gives pleasant spices and a vanilla nose. This wine is great with game and red meat and mature cheese.
47. **Bourgogne Rouge (Chambolle) Christine Felettig Pinot Noir ~ 2017 France** £45.00
(abv 13%)
The nose of ripe red and black berries. The taste of toasty oak, pepper and sweet spices. Ready for drinking now. Great example of a French Pinot Noir.
48. **Fleurie Domaine de la Madone ~ 2018 France** £48.00
(abv 14.5%)
The wine is characterised with flavours of cherries strawberries and plums. Hints of liquorice and spice. This is an easy drinking wine and does go well with fish. Yes, it is red so what!
49. **St Emilion Château Rocher Gardet Montagne ~ 2020 France** £53.00
(abv 14.5%)
Made from 90% Merlot and 10% Cabernet Franc, you first notice the intense cherry colour. The first nose is truffle and then given some air ripe fruits come through. The wine is aged for 12 months in the barrel.
50. **Château Poitevin Medoc ~ 2012 France** £50.00
(abv 12.5%)
Fresh and fruity, this has light tannins and a stalky blackcurrant character that will produce a smooth and juicy wine as it ages. Probably at its drinking prime.

- 51. Rioja Ygay Reserva Marques de Murrieta ~ 2016 Spain** £50.00
(abv 14%)
You first get the cherry and raspberry nose, they then give way to a more raisin and jam smell. The simple red fruits and the oak from the barrels make this a highly drinkable but not too complex wine. It is a very good Rioja.
- 52. Pinot Noir Kim Crawford ~2018 New Zealand** £48.00
(abv 13%)
Aged for 60% of the time in oak barrels, the rest in stainless steel give a hint of pepper on the palate. Lots of red fruit flavours and the background we get some baked spice, vanilla and perhaps caramel.
- 53. Syrah Reyneke ~ 2019 South Africa** £48.00
(abv 13%)
Red fruit flavours with a slight aniseed spice. Liquorice and white pepper tickle the nose followed by fragrant violet tones. Fine spicy tannins follow on the end of the palate.
- 54. Three Cape Ladies Warwick ~2017 South Africa** £48.00
(abv 14%)
These ladies have graced our wine list for many years. A blend of 40% Pinotage, 30% Cabernet Sauvignon and 30% Syrah gives rich plum aromas to compliment the full-bodied smooth tannins. Pinotage with classic French varieties, great match!
- 55. The Chocolate Block ~2020 South Africa** £50.00
(abv 14.5%)
Produced by a name impossible to type! This could be one of the best red wines we have had on the wine list for a while. South Africa does produce some great blended wines and this is no exception. Syrah 64%, 14% Grenache, 11% Cinsault, Cabernet Sauvignon 10% and Viognier 1%. Yes there is a hint of chocolate.
- 56. Chianti Medice ~ 2018 Italy** £48.00
(abv 12.5%)
The blend is 85% Sangiovese, 10% Merlot and 5% 'other'. Rich and silky red in the glass, light reveals a clear and intense colour. On the nose, fresh dark cherries, spice and a touch of pepper. Then the palate smooth and fresh with a long finish.
- 57. Valpolicella la Grola Allegrini ~ 2020 Italy** £48.00
(abv 13%)
A full bodied, intense and full-bodied wine. Dark red ruby in colour, it has a wide embracing bouquet with notes of wild berries, juniper, tobacco and coffee essence.
- 58. Pinot Noir Jules Taylor ~ 2020 New Zealand** £48.00
(abv 13.5%)
Delicately scented wine with floral and cherry aromas that flow into the palate where sappy tannins add an extra dimension. A Pinot Noir that does benefit from being in the glass.
- 58a Crozes Hermitage Domaine Melody ~2020 France** £75.00
(abv 14%)
Produced from the Syrah/Shiraz grape this wine has a deceptive easy drinking style! There is the scent of black fruits, prune and a hint of coffee late on, carries through to the palate giving an impressive finish.

- 59. Chateau neuf du Pape Cuvée Mourre des Perdrix ~2015 France** **£75.00**
(abv 15%)
A contender for the best value Chateauneuf du Pape. This is a blend of Grenache alongside Shiraz, Mourvitre and Cinsault grapes. Liquorice and dark, jammy berries and a herbal quality supported by notes of leather and a peppery finish
- 60. Pinot Noir Cloudy Bay ~ 2020 New Zealand** **£70.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Light bodied Pinot from the famous Cloudy Bay. There are red berry fruits and sweet spices with silky tannins. An elegant rather than a blockbuster that does develop in the glass.
- 61. Beaune 1er Prunier Bonheur ~ 2009 France** **£75.00**
(abv 13%)
Made from Pinot Noir grapes this fine example of Burgundy gives up lively raspberry and redcurrant on the nose. Sprightly with perhaps more charm than depth. Just right for drinking now.
- 62. Graves Les Hauts de Smith ~ 2016 France** **£70.00**
(abv 13.5%)
There is a nose of cloves, dark fruit and spices. On the palate it is more light-bodied to medium with tannins present. Having said that the wine does have a good balance.
- 63. Pomerol Château Les Cruzelles ~ 2014 France** **£80.00**
(abv 13.5%)
A sophisticated wine that combines Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Cabernet Sauvignon and Malbec. Black cherry on the nose and maybe just a hint of new oak. Good to drink for the next two years.
- 65. Medoc Château Goulee ~ 2003 France** **£75.00**
(abv 13.5%)
Produced in the Northern Medoc, this is a big wine with lots of fruit and exotic flavours. Expect to taste cassis, liquorice and smoke. Described as 'broad, expansive, savoury and pure'.
- 66. Shiraz Rosemont Estate ~ 2003 Australia** **£70.00**
(abv 15%)
Deep crimson in the glass. A nose of violets and stewed fruits. The palate then brings in prunes and spice followed by new leather and sweet cherry background. Produced in the Upper Hunter valley of South East Australia. A real Oz classic Shiraz.
- 68. Nuits St George Domaine Arnoux Lachaux ~ 2013 France** **£95.00**
(abv 13%)
Our red list signs off with a classic made from Pinot Noir. Opulent fruits are backed by raspberry notes and a rounded texture leads to a fine perfumed finish. There is a plummy richness to the wine.

ROSÉ WINE

- 69. Mont d'Horte Rosé ~ 2019 France** **£32.50**
(abv 13%)
A medium rosé with a soft red fruit nose. Clean and dry on the palate with freshness and attractive berry fruits. It has an elegant and light finish. Hailing from the Montpellier region you could with a bit of imagination be drinking this in the South of France!
- 70. Pinot Grigio Rosata Ponte Pietra ~ 2020 Italy** **£36.00**
(abv 12%)
A Lovely salmon pink colour, this Rosata is fresh and crisp with a strawberry perfume which gives way to vibrant cherry on the palate. There is a slight savoury note that adds depth and lively acidity which gives a crisp finish when the strawberries appear again.
- 71. Domaine Triennes ~ 2020 France** **£40.00**
(abv 13%)
This rosé from Provence has been described as the 'hippest' rosé in London at the moment! It really does invoke summer days in that region of France. It has a pretty pale hue and exhibit's a freshness due to its early bottling. There are aromas of red berries, strawberries, grapefruit and a hint of orange peel. It is a very quaffable wine, not only for the summer.

CHAMPAGNE AND SPARKING WINES

- 74. Prosecco di Valdobbiadene ~ NV Italy** £36.00
(abv 11.5%)
Plenty of fruit on the palate with aromas of pear and peach and a floral finish. Ideal as an aperitif. Great Italian fizz.
- 75. Tinwood Estate Sparkling Wine Brut ~ 2017 England** £52.00
(abv 12%)
Two miles north of us as the drunken crow flies! Blend of Pinot and Chardonnay gives aromas of citrus and melon. As with most English 'sparklers' a medium taste.
- 76. Champagne Brut Canard Duchéne ~ NV France** £57.00
(abv 12%)
This has been our 'house' champagne for 16 years a testament to its consistency and quality. Blend of Pinot and Chardonnay it is clean and fruity. Maybe flavours of baked bread and bruised apples. Fresh and easy drinking.
- 77. Pelorus Sparkling Wine ~ NV New Zealand** £58.00
(abv 12.5%)
Chardonnay dominates in this blend from different vintages. Ideal as an aperitif, crisp apple flavours backed by a nutty, yeasty complexity. Still a bit of a surprise from New Zealand.
- 78. Champagne Brut Rosé Canard Duchéne ~ NV France** £60.00
(abv 12%)
A delicate pink hue this wine stands apart for its intense fresh fruit aromas of strawberries with a subtle hint of grenadine. A backdrop of mineral notes gives an enhanced freshness.
- 79. Nyetimber Sparkling Wine Classic Cuvée ~ NV England** £68.00
(abv 12%)
A blend of 55% Chardonnay, 26% Pinot Noir and 19% Pinot Meunier. It has a tart, zingy lemon twist and a smoky creamy finish. Slightly drier than most English sparkling wine.
- 81. Champagne Gosset Grand Reserve ~ NV France** £88.00
(abv 12%)
This could be classed as the champagne expert's champagne, a blend of Grand Cru Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier. Orchard fruits, marzipan, sweet spices are felt initially. Then maybe melba toast, roasted almonds and lightly roasted coffee. We do like it!
- 82. Champagne Laurent-Perrier Cuvée Brut Rosé ~ NV France** £95.00
(abv 12%)
Pinot Noir, Chardonnay and Pinot Meunier are blended to make this well-known Rosé. There are strawberries, redcurrants, raspberries and black cherries to savour.
- 83. Champagne Veuve Cliquot Special Cuvée NV ~ France** £88.00
(abv 12.5%)
A gold colour with silver accents, you then taste cherries, plum and grapefruit with maybe a hint of liquorice. You move onto almonds, hazelnuts and brioche.
- 84. Champagne Bollinger Special Cuvée NV ~ France** £88.00
(abv 12%)
Patsy and Edina's tippie in AbFab makes its first appearance on our wine list after nearly 20 years! It has a rich buttery taste and all the flavours from one of the classic bottles of fizz *sweetie darling!*

DESSERT WINES

- 86. Muscat Beaune de Venise Domaine de Durban ~ 2015 France** £35.00
(375ml)
Glass
£12.50
(125ml)
(abv 15%)
- This fine dessert wine expresses itself with a high degree of finesse. Delicate flavours tickle the tongue with notes of pear and apricot. Good with all desserts especially chocolate.
- 87. Sauternes Raymond-Lafon ~ 2007 France** £65.00
Per Glass
£14.50
(125ml)
(abv 14%)
- This is a fine example of this famous dessert wine. It is a blend of Sémillon, Sauvignon Blanc and Muscadelle grapes that have been infected by *Botrytis Cinerea* or *noble rot* which causes the grapes to become 'raisined' giving the distinct sweetness to the wine. Because of this the production of the wine can vary considerably between vintages.
- 89. Château Boucasse Vendemiare ~ 2017 France** £38.00
(500ml)
(abv 12.5%)
- From South West France this wine has an intense nose of honeyed Satsuma and spice. A tropical fruit character on the palate with a fine concentrated finish. If you are looking for something a little different in a dessert wine then look no further. Has been described as 'impeccable poise without overpowering sweetness'.
- 89a Black Muscat Elysium ~ 2017 USA** £35.00
(375ml)
(abv 15%)
- This wine hails from California and the name Elysium is the Greek for heaven. Take your first sip and you will see it is aptly named. There is a rose aroma and a whole array of other fruits hit your palate. Personal favourite is to pour it over vanilla ice cream, very decadent!

MATURE PORT WINE

- 90. 10 year-old Tawny Port Taylors ~ Portugal** £55.00
Per Glass
Large 12.50
Small £9.50
(abv 20%)
- Aged in large wood casks for nearly all its years, this gives this port the distinctive red colour. There are aromas of ripe berry fruit with a delicate nuttiness and notes of chocolate. Smooth and silky on the palate with ripe figs.
- 91. Vintage Port** £8500

(abv 20%)
- We rotate our vintage port depending on what our wine merchant has in stock. They will all be around 2002/2005 in vintage from many of the well-known producers.
